Reading is an essential part of learning. In addition to supporting student growth throughout the year, reading helps us find our shared human experiences and broadens our worlds. As author Malorie Blackman reminds us, "Reading is an exercise in empathy; an exercise in walking in someone else's shoes for a while." This summer, students will examine new worlds and develop empathy by reading three books: *Out of My Mind* by Sharon M. Draper, and two other books of their choice.

During the first days of school, students will engage in making connections to our 2023-2024 school-wide theme of *Resilience*. **Resilience means the ability to bounce back from adversity or conflict**.


Below are the steps to complete the Summer Reading Assignment.

#### 1. All Community Read - Out of My Mind by Sharon M. Draper

We ask that *all* members of The Computer School community—students, parents/guardians, families, teachers and staff—read this young adult book that centers around the theme of resilience.

- **2. Two Choice Books:** Students must read at least TWO other books of their choice (see recommendations below).
- **3. Creative Response Assignment**: Students choose ONE of three options listed at the end of this letter to reflect on and respond to ONE of the three books they read. This assignment must be completed and presented on the first day of school.

Most people—her teachers, her doctors, her classmates—dismiss her as mentally challenged because she can't tell them otherwise. But Melody refuses to be defined by her disability. And she's determined to let everyone know it...somehow.
